### ESTATE-GROWN DRY RED WINE

Domaine Reserve, a single parcel wine, is made from the oldest vines of the winery vineyards. The age of the vines, outstanding exposure, and steep slope contribute to the unique personality of this wine expressed in its terroir. Winemaker Philippe Coquard uses a traditional fermentation to bring out the spice and berry flavors concentrated in the fruit. A year of aging in oak barrels enhances the depth, finesse, and complexity. Savor and enjoy!

- ❖ **Grape:** 95% Marechal Foch and  
5% Millot, estate-grown - Lake Wisconsin Viticultural Area
- ❖ **Production Method:** 100% crushed and destemmed, long warm fermentation
- ❖ **Aging:** 12 months of barrel aging - 50% American oak and 50% French oak
- ❖ **Sweetness:** dry
- ❖ **Alcohol:** 13.5%
- ❖ **Serving Temperature:** 60° - 65°
- ❖ **Ageability:** 5-10 years
- ❖ **History:** started making Domaine Reserve in 1976  
(originally called Estate Red)
